BIOGRAPHY

DR. MASSIMO MANGIALAVORI

The study of medical anthropology, from his early university years, led him to become interested in traditional medicines and to choose, later, to devote himself completely to Classical Homeopathic Medicine, which he has been practicing since 1985.

His original method of study and research, together with the meticulous collection of a vast and documented clinical material collected verbatim by his patients, arouses much interest in the international homeopathic community: in particular the clinical cases followed with long follow-ups and published with the authorization of the patients themselves.

In 2001 he founded and directs "Koinè: International School of Permanent Training in Classical Homeopathic Medicine": a school attended by colleagues from the international community, based in Bologna and Boston.

In 2003, after a long collaboration with Dr. Giovanni Marotta, he published "Praxis" the first book of homeopathic methodology in Italian, translated into English and German, and founded the foundations of his research and study model: The Method of Complexity in Homeopathic Medicine.

In 2008 he plans and directs the creation of "Homeovision", one of the most visited portals on an international level with scientific information aimed at doctors, health professionals, pharmacists and patients.

Author of several books published in Italian, English, German, Czechoslovak, Portuguese and various articles published in various national and international magazines.

In 2016, the publication of his Clinical Materia Medica began, currently reaching the 4th volume (Milk, Mushrooms, Rosaceae, Arachnids, Oils, Arnica-like). The same year he published on his portal a series of 50 synoptic conferences - in Italian and English - which illustrate the foundations of his study of as many homeopathic families, the result of over 30 years of clinical experience exclusively collected from patients.

In 2020 he completed the first version of his clinical repertory which in 2025 was updated to the second revised edition: Suggesta 2.0. A review in a modern, but above all clinical, key, with personal additions resulting from 40 years of experience and a database with approximately 11,500 patients.

He has collaborated actively for almost 20 years with David Warkentin in the development of the Mac Repertory and Reference Works.
